- WHEREAS: The years 1933 to 1945 represented among the bleakest years in human history with the mass murder of Jews and others including thousands of gay men and lesbians, Protestants and Catholic Clergy and lay people, Jehovah's Witnesses, Communists and political dissidents, handicapped persons and Gypsies, in a systematic genocide; and
- WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge representing a multiplicity of cultures, including Holocaust survivors and families of its victims, will never forget this age of human history; and
- WHEREAS: We, the people of Cambridge, to remain proud and affirming of our diversity, must be eternally vigilant against all forms of bigotry in our community and elsewhere and must speak out against any form of prejudice which can seep into the fabric of our lives providing a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
- WHEREAS: The events of 2002- 2003 have increased the need for all citizens to gather in remembrance and commitment to end all forms of violence and scapegoating locally, nationally and internationally; now be it therefore
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council joins with others across the country in remembering the events of the Holocaust and the lessons for today; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council invites all citizens of Cambridge to attend the evening commemoration program Wednesday, April 30, 7:00-8:30 PM at Temple Beth Shalom of Cambridge entitled "*Remembering the stark beginnings*" with remarks from Cambridge resident Eva Moseley, music from the Cambridge Community Chorus and the Keshet Hebrew After-School students and participants from the Jewish, Christian and Islamic faith communities; and be it further
