Please be advised that Jean Ferrara, of 158 Marguerite Avenue, Waltham, Massachusetts, is hereby making claim against the City of Cambridge, for personal injuries incurred by her as the result of an accident which occurred on October 21, 1979, in the City of Cambridge, and which was caused by the negligence of the City of Cambridge, its agents, servants, or employees; and that Anthony Ferrara, also of 158 Marguerite Avenue, Waltham, Massachusetts, husband of the said Jean Ferrara, is hereby making claim against the City of Cambridge for consequential damages sustained by him; said claims are being made in accordance with the provisions of the general laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
