WHEREAS: The Cambridge Common is a very popular spot in the City of Cambridge for recreation and sightseeing, as well as a heavily used area for MBTA bus passengers; and

WHEREAS: The Common also experiences a heavy flow of bicycle traffic, often at such speeds that may be dangerous to the pedestrian traffic; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager confer with the Acting Commissioner of Public Works and the Director of the Recreation Department on the feasibility of constructing a bicycle path on the Cambridge Common that would be situated in such a way as to not interfere with the heavy pedestrian traffic there; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report on the progress of this project within one month.
