Dear Ms. Sullivan:

At their meeting on March 23rd, the East Cambridge Planning Team raised concerns about the escalating rodent problem in the neighborhood. Apart from the frustrated attempts to control the rodent population invading residents of Gore Street, we have had new complaints from various neighbors on Fulkerson Street. With new demolition and construction at Binney and Bent Streets, the ECPT feels that more needs to be done by citywide services to ensure that the rodent population is kept at bay.

The Planning Team also feels that, since this problem is generated by the constant construction going on in East Cambridge, developers should contribute to the cost of baiting on private property for those residents affected. If developers bait their property, the rodents need a new, clean environment to reside and what better place than someone's backyard. I do hope we can reach an agreement with city officials and developers in the very near future.
