Peter A. Rubbico of Medford, a retired Cambridge police captain, died Friday in Symmes Hospital in Arlington. He was 83.

He lived in Cambridge for 40 years before moving to Medford.

Mr. Rubbico served 33 years with the Cambridge police, retiring in 1968 as captain of the department.

He was a member of the St. Rocco Society and served as president of the Retired Policemen's Association of Cambridge.
