

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Sixty-four.

An Ordinance,

in further addition to the Ordinance in rela-
tion to the Fire Department.

As is ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. Each Steam Fire Engine Company ap-
pointed by the Mayor and Aldermen, shall
consist of fourteen men, and shall have a Fire-
man, Assistant-Foreman, Engineer, Fireman, Dri-
ver of the Engine, Driver of the Hose Carriage,
and eight-Hosemen. The Engineer and the two
Drivers shall be constantly employed, and shall
at all times be in or about the Engine House,
except when unavoidably absent.

Sec. 2. The Engineer of each Steam Engine
Company shall be accountable for the proper
performance of all duties required of the Dri-
vers and Fireman, and make report to the
Chief Engineer of any neglect on their part.

Sec. 3. There shall be paid monthly to the driver of each Horse Carriage such sum as the City Council may from time to time determine, which sum shall be paid to said driver personally, or to his order.

Sec. 4. The drivers of each Steam Engine and the drivers of the Horse Carriage, shall drive and have the charge of the horses of the Engine and Horse Carriage, respectively, and have the same at all times ready for immediate use, and the stable kept neat and clean. They shall also assist the Engineers in keeping the house and apparatus clean, and they and the Engineers shall perform such other duty as may be required of them by the Chief Engineer.

Sec. 5. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
