and be it further

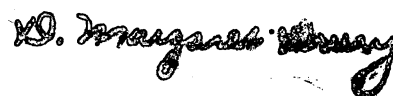

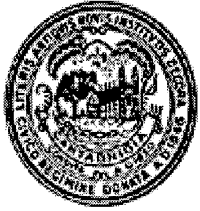

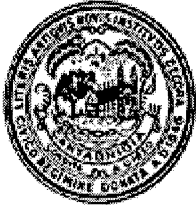
