In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, May 12. 1865.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that

Temple Street, between Main Street and Austin Street should be made of a uniform width throughout, the same being now more than thirty feet in width near Austin Street; it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to the owners of land abutting on said Temple Street, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to lay out said Temple Street from Main Street to Austin Street, as a public street thirty feet in width, the same to lie on the Southeasterly side of the present Northwesterly line of said street, as the fence now stands, and that ~~that this Board intends to~~ ~~the Street before mentioned, by taking a~~ ~~portion of~~ ~~land and laying out the same as a public street~~ and that

Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of May current, at 8 1/2 o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
