

Notes for the City Council - meeting of March 29, 1999

The following is a summary of a few actions that the City Council should initiate to address citizen concerns. In the course of reassessing of the nature of current problems and researching new possibilities for addressing those problems, they will also contribute to the ability of the citizens to take useful and needed actions.

1. Find out from the Community Development Department whether the schedule of the CGMAC allows for the completion of the City-wide Rezoning before the current expiration of the IPOP in October.
2. Consider ways in which the City Council, exercising its legislative and executive powers, might make the Planning Board more responsible to the City by reviewing its actions.
3. Discuss what actions are needed to prevent further erosion of future potential for environmentally desirable arrangements of land use and related transportation. Today's costs of attempting to do this are the result of the yesterday's evasions. Instead of crying over what might have been, cease denying that whatever it costs now, it will cost much more a few years hence if you do nothing.
