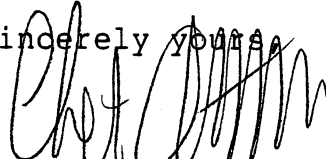
Thank you for writing to me in support of HR 3, the Early Childhood Education and Development Act. You will be pleased to know that we are in agreement on this issue.

HR 3 emphasizes educational and developmental activities, not merely custodial care, for young children. It expands child care to include before- and after-school programs for children age four and over. In addition, HR 3 will expand the Head Start program to provide full-day service.

The Early Childhood Education and Development Act uses already existing programs that have a proven track record to dramatically expand school based child care for millions of families. I am pleased to report that this important legislation has been incorporated into the Budget Reconciliation Act and will be acted upon shortly on the House floor. You can rest assured that it will receive my full support.
