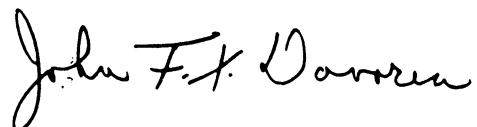

In addition, to carry on any activity consistent with and in furtherance of the foregoing purposes permitted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to a corporation organized under the provisions of Chapter 180 of the Massachusetts General Laws, provided that any such activity is permitted under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

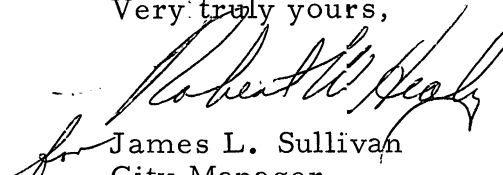
