Committee

to which was referred the petition of John N. Riseman, et al to amend the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Cambridge by establishing a "Limited Zoning Moratorium" on non-governmental, tax exempt institutional uses after hearing held on April 26, 1978 the committee reports as follows:

The committee heard from the petitioner John Riseman who outlined his proposed amendment which would prevent permits for new construction, demolition or occupancy other than those now permitted under the code for the tax paying sector, in those areas designated as "Temporary Limited Development Moratorium." He further stated that the proposed amendment to the Zoning Map would be by the overlay of this designation over all areas of the Zoning Map presently designated Residence A-1, Residence A-2, Residence B, Residence C-1 and Residence C-2.

No other proponents appeared at the call of the Chairman, Councillor Frisoli, and the hearing for the proponents was closed at 7:35 P. M.

The Chairman now called for the opposition. No one appeared in response to his call and the Chairman declared the hearing closed.

Councillor Frisoli moved that the petition be referred to the City Council without recommendation while awaiting the report of the Planning Board and the motion carried.

The hearing closed at 7:35 P. M. and the Chair declared a recess before proceeding to the next order of business.
