Dear Colleague,

As you know the Cambridge Peace Commission is sponsoring a walk to Greenfield to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the bombing of Hiroshima.

The walk will leave Cambridge City Hall at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, August 7th.

I intend to walk with this group to the Belmont line where the group will join officials from Belmont. I hope very much that you can join this walk for all or part of the distance. In any event, I hope you can be at City Hall at 8:45 a.m. for brief departure ceremonies.

Mayor Eugene Brune of Somerville will join me in the first leg of the walk (to the Belmont line) as will Cambridge senior citizens.

Those marching all the way to Greenfield will include Cambridge high school students, students and young people from 8 countries now visiting Cambridge, a delegation of 16 students from Nuremburg, West Germany, and Cambridge adult citizens. The group making the entire march will number about 60; local community groups and churches will house and feed them along the way.

I intend also to walk with them on the final leg of their journey into Greenfield on Tuesday, August 13th.
