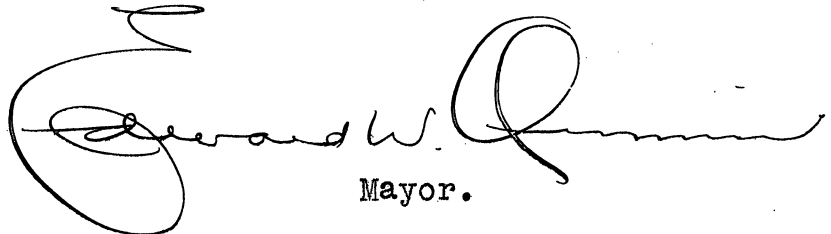

WHEREAS:

An offer has been received by the City Council for the purchase of City owned land, with buildings thereon, situated on Massachusetts Avenue, it is

ORDERED:

That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is authorized, in the name of and in behalf of the City of Cambridge, to sell and convey to Thomas E. Kennedy for the sum of Sixteen Thousand (16,000) Dollars a parcel of land situated and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the northeasterly line of North Avenue (now Massachusetts Avenue) at the division line between land of now or formerly H. N. Plummer and land of the City of Cambridge, thence running northeasterly along said land of H. N. Plummer 178 feet more or less to land of now or formerly P. R. Russell, thence turning and running southeasterly by land of said Russell 85.67 feet to land of now or formerly John J. and Robert Henderson, thence turning and running southwesterly by land of said John J. and Robert Henderson and land of now or formerly Pliny Nickerson 168.7 feet to the northeasterly line of North Avenue (now Massachusetts Avenue), thence turning and running northwesterly by the northeasterly line of North Avenue (now Massachusetts Avenue) 85 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 14,755 square feet more or less.

The above described parcel of land is shown upon a plan entitled: "Public Property of the City of Cambridge" dated July, 1877, drawn by the City Engineer and on file in the office of the City Engineer of Cambridge, Mass.
