pavers, out of these railroad blocks, they will average 16 inches long and
from 8 to 10 inches square that is the dimensions of the greatest part of them
it will take 5 or 6 drill holes to split each block to get 4 or 5 city pavers out
of, there may be an odd one that can be split with a chisel, we get 2½ cents
per hole in a stone yard for drilling these quality of holes, you can see there
will not be a big days wages at the above figures, by doing them
properly
