WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council was deeply saddened to learn of the death of JULIUS EPPS of September 28, 1994, after a long battle with illness; and

WHEREAS: JULIUS EPPS, son of the late Ernest Epps and Alice Brooks, was born on in the City of Cambridge on October 25, 1927, and attended Cambridge public schools, where he excelled in sports; and

WHEREAS: JULIUS EPPS served with distinction on the United States Army from January 1946 to April 1947, and upon completion of his duties received an honorable discharge; and

WHEREAS: JULIUS EPPS organized "Club International" in the late 1960's, bringing nationally recognized musical groups to the Greater Boston area, and also during his career worked as the manager of the Crossroads Lounge in Jamaica Plain, the Clock Cafe and Slade's Tee on the Green in Roxbury; and

WHEREAS: JULIUS EPPS is survived by his wife, Flora of Lynn, three daughters, Julie Epps, Janice Lark, and Joanne Douglas of Los Angeles, one son, Roger Epps of Boston, one sister, Theresa Wilson of Cambridge, and two brothers, Ernest Epps of Boston and his twin, Julian Epps of Somerville; and

WHEREAS: JULIUS EPPS is also survived by four grandchildren, Antonio, Billy, Michael, and Janice, one great granddaughter, Ashley, two sisters-in-law, Lois and Lenora, a host of nephews and nieces, and many, many friends; now therefore be it
