To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 64, regarding the parking crisis at Huron Towers, please be advised that the Traffic and Parking Director has reviewed the proposal from Huron Towers to allow residents to park along Huron Avenue and at the end of the Golf Course.

Huron Avenue, from the Golf Course to Grove Street has approximately a 40 foot pavement. The only restrictions are street cleaning on the 4th Tuesday and Wednesday, from April to November and emergency snow regulations.

With the street cleaning season just about over, the Traffic Department has no problem with the residents of 700 Huron Avenue parking along Huron Avenue from the Golf Course parking area to Grove Street. This section is not restricted for resident parking. For public safety reasons, they must adhere to the snow emergency regulations just as everyone else in the City must do. Once the street is cleaned, the spaces will once again be available for parking to the general public on a first come first serve basis.
