WHEREAS: In April 1993, in commemoration of the tenth year of Sister City ties between the City of Cambridge and Tsukuba, Japan, our City did graciously receive a visit from The Honorable Misao Kimura, Mayor of Tsukuba, Japan, and his accompanying delegation; and

WHEREAS: During that visit, Mayor Kimura did promise that, as a gesture of good will, Tsukuba, Japan would present to the City of Cambridge an exquisitely carved and detailed Japanese stone lantern, measuring approximately twelve feet in height and weighing approximately three tons; and

WHEREAS: Our Sister City has fulfilled her promise, and said lantern is now awaiting designation of a suitable place for permanent display; and

WHEREAS: In October, 1994, an appointed delegation from our Sister City, including the Honorable Mayor Misao Kimura, will again visit our City, to make a formal presentation of said lantern; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That upon determination of an appropriate location by the Cambridge City Council, the lantern shall be placed in said location, so that all residents and visitors to the City of Cambridge who pass and linger there shall know the generosity, beauty, and good will of our Sister City, Tsukuba, Japan.
