In accordance
with the advice of the Committee
on roads & bridges, I have finished
up my ground in a suitable
manner, & with as little expence
as possible, since the grading of
Charles river, ^{street} which was done
after I had raised my fence
& filled up ground, according
to the grade given me by City
Engineers, & besides the loss of
loam & gravel, purchased
last year, find the expence
this year has been a trifle
less than fifty dollars, a sum
entirely out of my power to defray,
unless your honorable Body see
fit to remunerate me, which
I feel confident you will do,

City Engineer, as I am entirely
unable to pay the workmen
