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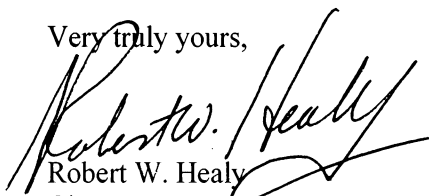
To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report Item Number 03-76, regarding a report on the City becoming a sponsor for the 2003 Race to Stop Global Warming, Assistant City Manager for Community Development Beth Rubenstein reports the following:

City staff have been working with the Greenhouse Network to assess the possibility of hosting of the event in Cambridge. The event involves an 8K run, 5K walk, and a clean energy fair. Last year, the event was held in Newton and attracted about 600 participants.

Due to logistical considerations, the Race organizers have decided to hold the event in Newton again this year. Their priorities included finding a race route that would not conflict with other events and that could provide sufficient space for both a staging area and the clean energy fair. The Race organizers and City staff have agreed to discuss the potential for Cambridge to host the event in 2004, once this year's event is over.
