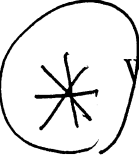

It would be difficult to spell out many major achievements in the life of Pat. His accomplishments were mostly small personalized favors he enjoyed granting. To recall his life I am reminded immediately of the divine gifts he possessed - faith, hope, and love. His genuine love of people was apparent to all who approached him. After his stint in the U.S. Army returning home after serving in the Phillipines, he worked at B.F. Goodrich and became a union shop steward. He later owned a Shell Gas station on Mount Auburn St. He gave away more gasoline than he received cash for. His customers were always going to pay him next week.

His skill at leadership really manifested itself while he was Commander of the Mt. Auburn V.F.W. He had a vision of a new post quarters which would soon become a focal point for the entire Cambridge community.

* [He formed a partnership with the Sacred Heart Parish to help raise revenue by weekly bingo games. He provided meeting space for Haggerty Community Schools activities; Little League organizational meetings; Senior Citizen parties; various local unions such as police, fire, and carpenters. Candidates for election to local, state, and national office were welcome to conduct rallies and fund raisers.

[With Pat's encouragement the Flaherty Road Race and the Dept. of Human Services Road Race set forth from the post. Neighborhood Halloween and Christmas parties were common place for many years. Food baskets were distributed to needy families during Thanksgiving and Christmas.
