May 31, 1882

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Cottage street, between Magazine & River street*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *forty feet* in width between *Magazine and River street*

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *Arthur Hodges* Civil Engineer, dated *January 30, 1882*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid.
