
We respectfully request an appropriation of funds to finance two positions and material resources necessary to maintain the detail office.

**§ 53C. Separate fund for deposit and disbursement of monies received as payment for off-duty work details of employees; appropriation of funds; fee**

All money received by a city, town or district as compensation for work performed by one of its employees on an off-duty work detail which is related to the employee's regular employment shall be deposited in the treasury and shall be kept in a fund separate from all other monies of such city, town or district and notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-three, shall be expended without further appropriation, in such manner and at such times as shall, in the discretion of the authority authorizing such off-duty work detail, compensate the employee for such services.

When necessary, a city, town or district may appropriate funds to be placed in the special fund authorized by the preceding paragraph to be used for the purposes for which the fund was established and a city, town or district may establish a fee not to exceed ten per cent of the costs of services authorized under this section. Any such fee received shall be credited as general funds of the city, town or district and shall not be used again without further appropriation.

Districts shall include regional school districts.

Added by St.1970, c. 344. Amended by St.1973, c. 773.

1970 Enactment. St.1970, c. 344, approved May 20, 1970, added this section to read: "In any city or town which accepts the provisions of this section, all moneys received by it in payment for off-duty work details of members of its police department shall be deposited in the treasury, shall be kept in a separate fund by the treasurer apart from any other of its money, funds or other property, and shall be expended

without further appropriation at the direction of the chief of police or other officer having similar duties for the purpose of paying its police officers for such off-duty work details, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-three."

1973 Amendment. St.1973, c. 773, an emergency act, approved Sept. 17, 1973, rewrote the section.

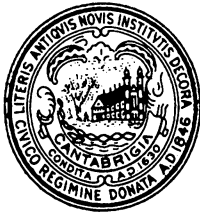
**§ 54. Investment of trust funds**

Trust funds, including cemetery perpetual care funds, unless otherwise provided or directed by the donor thereof, shall be placed at interest in savings banks, trust companies incorporated under the laws of the commonwealth, banking companies incorporated under the laws of the commonwealth which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or national banks, or invested by cities and towns in paid-up shares and accounts of and in co-operative banks, or in shares of savings and loan associations or in shares or savings deposits of federal savings and loan associations doing business in the commonwealth to an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars, or in bonds or notes which are legal investments for savings banks. Cities and towns having such funds in the custody of the treasurer in an aggregate amount in excess of one million dollars may also invest such funds in securities, other than mortgages or collateral loans, which are legal for the investment of funds of savings banks under the laws of the commonwealth; provided, that not more than fifteen per cent of any such trust funds shall be invested in bank stocks and insurance company stocks, nor shall more than one and one half per cent of such funds be invested in the stock of any one bank or insurance company. This section shall not apply to Boston.

Amended by St.1970, c. 53; St.1971, c. 299.

1970 Amendment. St.1970, c. 53, approved Feb. 24, 1970, provided for investment of funds "in excess of one million dollars" instead of "two million dollars" in second sentence.

1971 Amendment. St.1971, c. 299, approved May 13, 1971, authorized investment in "savings deposits" of federal savings and loan associations.


