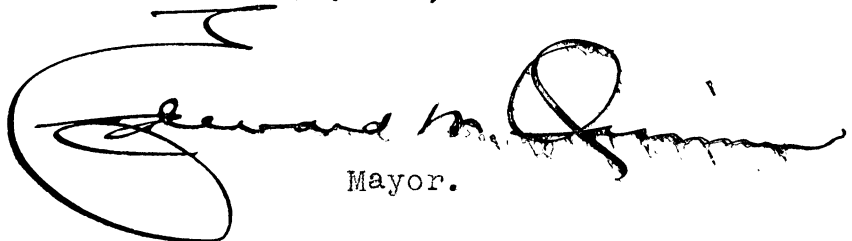
The Honorable, the City Council:

Official announcement has been received by the City Council from His Honor the Mayor of the death of Andrew J. Rady, we desire to join with him in testifying to the worth of our deceased friend.

Mr. Rady was born in Cambridge and resided here during his entire lifetime. At an early age he embarked in business on Main St. near Lafayette Square where he manufactured druggists' sundries. Later on he attended Boston University, was admitted to the bar, and, for the past thirty years has been a respected member of the legal profession. He has served his native city in various capacities: as a member of the Common Council, Board of Aldermen, Water Board and Representative to the General Court. In every position he occupied he gave to the public splendid service, was unselfish in his devotion to duty and untiring in his efforts to advance the interests of his native city. He was a man of upright personality, strong integrity, quiet demeanor and of unfailing loyalty to his friends. It is therefore

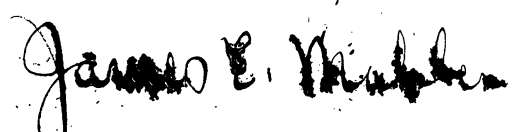
