Dennis J. Callahan was an able and dedicated public servant who achieved the rank of senior examiner in the Dept. of Insurance of the Commonwealth, and

Dennis J. Callahan lived the life of the Good Samaritan and was eulogized as "one who did so much for so many," and his charity and courtesy extended beyond the bounds of race and creed, now therefore be it
