

CITY OF BOSTON.

In Board of Aldermen, March 17, 1890.

Ordered:

That the City of Boston, on its part, hereby determines the location of the avenue connecting Harvard Bridge with Main street in Cambridge to be between the lines as shown upon a plan on file in the engineer's office in the City of Cambridge, dated November 7, 1887, but crossing the location and tracks of the Boston and Albany Railroad by an overhead bridge, the details of such bridge and crossing to be fixed by the Board of Railroad Commissioners.

Passed. Sent down for concurrence. March 20 came up concurred.
