ORDERED: That the City Manager increase the sense of urgency in the search which will insure that a permanent site is found which will assure a year-round shelter to carry on the work which was carried on so well at the Concord Avenue Armory, hopefully by the Fall of 1989; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council with a progress estimate by June 12, 1989.
