

Cambridge port June 22nd 1874

To the Mayor and Alderman as
Surveyors of Highways of the City of Cambridge

Having received Notice that
your Board by an order dated April 25th 1874 have
directed the Supt of Streets to remove My fence
on My estate on Pearl Street at the corner of Franklin
Street for the alledged reason that the same is an
encroachment upon Pearl Street and have been
Notified by the Supt of Streets that he will proceed
to remove said fence unless I remove the same.
I hereby respectfully protest against said order
and against such Notices & such profound action
and hereby give Notice that I Claim a good & perfect
title to all the land enclosed by the fence on its
present line as it is now built & now stands on
Pearl Street and I respectfully petition your
Honorable Board to rescind said order And
I hereby give Notice that I shall hold the City
responsible for all losses damages & expenses
suffered by me for the removal of said fence if the

same is removed I also give Notice that in case
I shall myself remove said fence. I do the
same without waiving any of my claims of title
and without waiving any of my rights or claims
for damages and do the same under protest
and under the compulsion of said order &
