Whereas it is adjudged by this Board, that the public necessity and convenience require that Dunster Street, from about Auburn Street to Lane now or late of Edwards, should be widened on its North-Westerly side, in accordance with the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, this day submitted to the Board.

Ordered, That a strip of land on the North-Westerly side of said Dunster Street, extending from a point three and nine tenths feet from the old line of about Auburn Street, to said land now or late of Edwards, said strip being three and sixty-seven hundredths feet in width, be taken for public use and laid out as a part of said Dunster Street, and a public way, according to a certain Plan drawn by J. L. Chase, City Engineer, dated April 20, 1871, and now before this Board.

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken, and for the injury to the buildings thereon, and all damages whatsoever, be estimated and awarded as follows:-

To William Wright-

buildings and other property standing on the
land so taken as of record.

In Board of Aldermen, April 27, 1861/1870.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board, that the public necessity and convenience require that the channel Auburn Street, from Dunster Street to land of William Reed, at the corner of channel Auburn and Brighton Streets, should be widened on its South Westerly side, in accordance with the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, this day submitted to the Board, so as to be fifty feet in width.

Ordered, That a strip of land on the South Westerly side of said channel Auburn Street, extending from Dunster Street to land of William Reed, said strip being three and nine-tenths feet in width at Dunster Street, and eleven and three-tenths feet in width at its North Westerly end, be taken for public use and laid out as a part of said channel Auburn Street, and a public way, according to a certain Plan drawn by J. E. Chase, City Engineer, dated April 24, 1870, and now before this Board.

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken and for the injury to the buildings thereon, and

all damages whatsoever, be estimated and
awarded as follows:-
