To The Honorable, The City Council:

Attached is an order requesting the transfer of \$8,000.00 in the General Fund from the Mayor's Office Salary & Wages Account to the Mayor's Office Other Ordinary Maintenance Account to provide funds to cover additional operating costs related to the Mayor's Summer Youth Employment Program.

The 1993 Mayor's Summer Youth Program has been very successful and has attained its goal of providing a meaningful summer employment for approximately 512 Cambridge youth including a Director, three Assistants and thirty-seven Counselors. This represents a 25% increase over last year, and more than double the size of the 1991 program. The youth have worked many different worksites in Cambridge departments and local non-profit agencies and have been exposed to various types of workshops and social activities which were designed to reinforce their professional and social skills over a period of six weeks.

The youth were also required to attend a series of special events and workshops conducted by a host of leaders in the community that included Mel King who led a discussion on leadership and community activism; Poncho Brown gave a seminar on peer pressure, substance abuse, youth violence and AIDS prevention; Yvette Dalton held a workshop on resume writing and career training; Mo Vaughan of the Boston Red Sox made a special appearance to address issues on work ethics and self-esteem; and Kris Parker (KRS-ONE), rapper and community activist spoke on the value of education.
