- WHEREAS: This City Council wishes to recognize Chrest E. Nikas, ninety-two years young, who immigrated to this country and to Cambridge from Greece in 1913; and
- WHEREAS: Chrest recognized early in life that people such as he needed a focal point to meet and discuss mutual concerns and to develop a support group, he established the Greek American Political Club, which at the time, consisted of six men of Greek heritage who held meetings in Chrest's home at 84 School Street, where his late wife Agnes would later translate the Club's by-laws into English; and
- WHEREAS: The idea of the Club became so popular, membership increased, causing them to move to larger quarters at 504 Massachusetts Avenue; and finally to 288 Green Street, where some two hundred members meet regularly; and
- WHEREAS: The Club is involved in many charitable pursuits, one of which is providing a \$500.00 allotment to each member in the event of death, in order to assist a family at a difficult time in life; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep gratitude to Mr. Chrest E. Nikas for his hard work, perseverance and sincerity throughout the years to the Greek American Political Club; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Nikas on behalf of the entire City Council.
