IN CITY COUNCIL  
May 5, 1986

- WHEREAS: Cigarette smoking is a leading cause of death from heart disease, lung cancer, and similar causes, and therefore constitutes a grave danger to the public health; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has often acted to protect its citizens from this danger, especially by regulating smoking in restaurants and other public places; and
- WHEREAS: It is therefore particularly obnoxious that a major tobacco company, Philip Morris Inc., has introduced a new cigarette under the brand name "Cambridge"; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council condemns this abuse of our city's good name for the benefit of a death-dealing industry, and calls upon the citizens of Cambridge to boycott this new cigarette; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk send copies of this resolution to Philip Morris and to the Massachusetts Group Against Smoking Pollution (GASP).
