WHEREAS:-

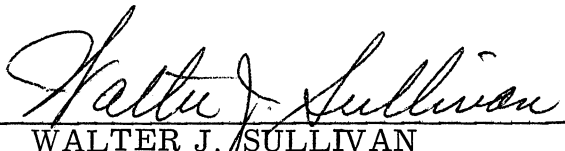
