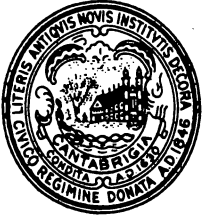

Dear Councillors:

As I reported to you last week, I have prepared a list of recommended improvements to Sennott Park based upon my discussions with representatives of the neighborhood and my staff designees on the project.


Several of these recommendations involve operational expenses such as lighting, supervision and maintenance, that I am considering within the present budget. I have directed that the new lighting be installed immediately and that work is nearly complete with the beneficial effects already felt by the neighborhood.

The remaining improvements involve capital expenditures. These include:

1. Removal and repair of selected portions of the masonry walls.
2. Installation of new fencing and relocation of the softball backstop.
3. Regrading of portions of the grounds.
4. Installation of the new drinking fountains

Estimates given for this work by qualified contractors indicate that the total capital cost will not exceed \$20,000. I recommend that the Council appropriate this sum to the Capital Improvement Account. Attached is a proposed order to that effect.
