- WHEREAS: Joyce later became a Commonwealth Service Corps Volunteer through the Cambridge Economic Opportunity Program, working with the Cambridge Tenant Senate as an advocate for tenants in public housing; and
- WHEREAS: As an active member of the Western Avenue Baptist Church, Joyce takes charge of a free food distribution program which provides tremendous help to people in her community; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation to Joyce Lee Smith for her dedication to the people who may not be so fortunate in life and for her volunteer work within the community; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Joyce on behalf of the entire City Council.
