

City of Cambridge,
in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

An Ordinance,
supplementary to an Ordinance, establishing a system
of accountability in the expenditures of the City.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. Any sum of money, which shall have been
specially appropriated for the payment of principal
or interest due on any note or other security of the
City or of the Town of Cambridge, may be drawn from
the Treasury and paid by the order of the Mayor, for
the purpose for which it was appropriated, without
any action on the part of the Committee on Accounts;
and whenever it shall be necessary to pay money in
advance, on contracts made, or for work begun but not
completed, the Mayor, upon being satisfied of such necessi-
ty, may draw his order on the Treasurer for the same;
Provided, however, that no such order shall be drawn for
more than five hundred dollars, at any one time, without
the special authority of the City Council.

2. The seventh section of an Ordinance, establishing
a system of accountability in the expenditures of the
City, passed May 25th 1846, is hereby repealed.
