To the Honorable, the Mayor, and the City Council,

City of Cambridge, Mass.

Gentlemen:

The Board of Health has been requested by the trustees of the Cambridge City Hospital to move the Tuberculosis Dispensary from the hospital building, as soon as possible. When moving the Tuberculosis Dispensary, it is desired to move the Dental Clinic at the same time, in order that the different sections of the department may not be too widely scattered.

In submitting the estimates for this appropriation, no amount was included for the Dispensary, General Expenses, because the Board felt that the arrangement at the Hospital was a permanent one. Therefore it becomes necessary now to ask for an appropriation for this purpose. The Board respectfully asks for an appropriation for the remaining eight months of the financial year as follows:
