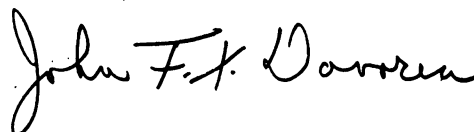

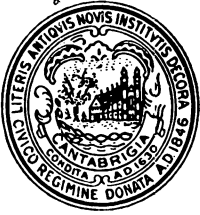

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

Massachusetts Community Center, Incorporated

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

Charitable and educational purposes, to wit: the development and implementation of programs of research, information, and education for the people of various disadvantaged communities of the Commonwealth; the establishment and maintenance of educational facilities responsive to the needs of people of those communities; the provision of financial, consultative, and other supportive services to develop and sustain organizations in those communities which seek to meet community needs or to provide education or information to those communities, through community newspapers or otherwise; and the solicitation, collection, and distribution of funds for those several purposes; but no part of the purposes of the corporation shall involve participation or intervention in the campaign of any candidate for public office, nor any substantial activity designed to or attempting to influence any legislation. Nothing shall be deemed to be a purpose of the corporation which is outside the scope of charitable, civic, or educational activities, as those terms are used in Section 501(c) (3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954.
