Born in Quincy, Mr. Lind was a graduate of Quincy High School, class of 1950. He graduated from Boston University in 1958.

He served with the Army from 1951 to 1954, with the 3rd Division during the Korean War.

Mr. Lind worked for the South Shore Broadcasting Co., and was a program director and announcer for WJDA-AM radio. He hosted the "Party Line," a daily call-in show, for more than a decade. He worked at WJDA-AM from 1960 until his retirement in 2000.

Mr. Lind was recognized as Citizen of the Year by the Quincy Jewish War Veterans in 1997 and won several radio awards from United Press International and The Associated Press. He was the grand marshal of the Quincy Christmas Parade in 2000, a Rotary Paul Harris Fellow and a charter member of the House of Prayer Lutheran Church in Hingham. He was twice past president of the Scituate Rotary Club.

Mr. Lind is survived by his wife, Joan B. (Soltesz); two sons, James R. of Scituate and Jeffrey W. of Norwell; a daughter, Marcia J. Short of Duxbury; two brothers, Fred C. Jr. of Framingham and Alvin P. of Scituate; and seven grandchildren.
