RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Bailey family on behalf of the entire City Council.

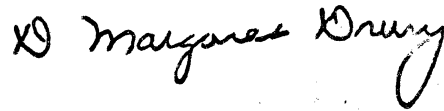

Obituaries

James Bailey, 76, retired justice of Cambridge District Court

James W. Bailey of Boston, a retired justice of the Cambridge District Court, died Thursday in Boston Medical Center after suffering a stroke. He was 76.

A native of Roanoke, Va., Judge Bailey earned a bachelor's degree from Virginia State College and a law degree from Boston University School of Law in 1948.

He served in the Army as a staff sergeant from 1943 to 1946.

Judge Bailey was admitted to the Massachusetts Bar in 1948, and started his career in private practice as a trial lawyer. He then served as an assistant US attorney in Massachusetts, as clerk pro-tempore of Boston Juvenile Court, and as an assistant attorney general for Massachusetts.

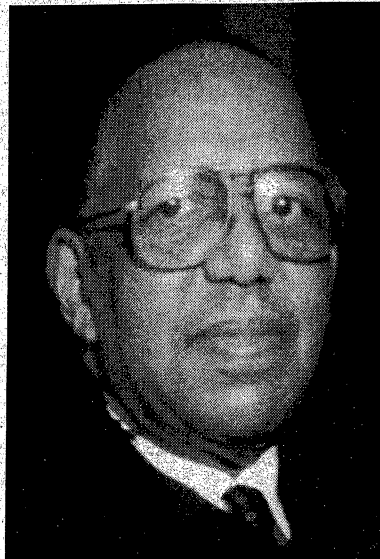
For 15 years, he was justice of the 3d District Court of Middlesex County. He later served as a special assistant US attorney and volunteer attorney for the Executive Office of Elder Affairs.

Judge Bailey was a past member of the board of directors and vice president of the National Legal Defender Program. He also served on the CLEO summer faculty at Harvard University and was clinical professor of law at Boston University School of Law.

He was a past vice president of Metco, legal counsel for the Boston NAACP branch, and a member of the grievance committee of the Boston Bar Association.

Judge Bailey was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity. He also was an elder and chairman trustee of the Gloucester Memorial Presbyterian Church.

He leaves his wife, Mary of Boston; two daughters, Elizabeth and Jane, both of Boston; two sons,

A funeral will be held tonight at 7 in Roxbury Presbyterian Church. Burial will be in the National Veterans Cemetery in Bourne.
