ORDERED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Director of Traffic and Parking, the Chief of Police and the Commissioner of Public Works to take the required action and to issue all necessary permits in connection with the Portuguese-American Communities of Greater Boston, relative to the "Day of Portugal" parade to be held on Sunday, June 1, 1986 in order to accomplish the following:-

1. Close Cardinal Medeiros Avenue from Cambridge Street to Hampshire Street from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and to provide, during the same time period the necessary escorts and traffic controls for the parade route from Cardinal Medeiros Avenue to Berkshire Street onto Cambridge Street up to Prospect Street onto Massachusetts Avenue up to the Cambridge Common.
2. The use of the Cambridge Common from 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of selling food and non-alcoholic refreshments and for the exhibition of folk dancing groups and bands.
3. The use of one flat bed truck to provide transportation for the Cambridge Rindge and Latin School band.
4. The raising of the Portuguese and American flags at City Hall on the morning of June 1, 1986 and remaining raised until Friday, June 6, 1986.
5. The participation, where possible, of the prestigious members of the Cambridge Police, Cambridge Fire and Cambridge Hospital Departments.
6. The assistance, where appropriate, for the hanging of two banners, one across Prospect Street and one across Massachusetts Avenue. Said banners should be subject to the conditions of sign permit applications, including proper bonding provisions, holding the City of Cambridge harmless from any liability. Further, that the banners should be provided by the Portuguese-American Communities of Greater Boston

; and be it further

ORDERED:

That any permits granted for street closures and parades, as well as other festival activities be subject to the condition that fire lanes be kept open at all times for the safety of the public, as determined by the Chief of the Fire Department.

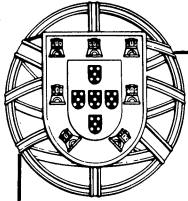

In accordance to our recent conversation, I, in the name of the Portuguese Parade Committee, submit to you and to the members of the Cambridge City Council for your consideration and approval, this request:

The Portuguese-American Communities of Greater Boston are organizing the traditional Parade to commemorate the Day of Portugal on Sunday, June 1, 1986, between 3:00PM and 6:00PM.

The Committee requests:

1. The closing and use of the following streets for the Parade line-up and route. Cardinal Medeiros Ave, Berkshire St., Cambridge St, Prospect St. and Massachusetts Ave up to the Cambridge Common.

2. The use of the Cambridge Common from 3:00PM to 8:00PM for the purpose of selling food and non-alcoholic refreshments. Also for the exhibition of folk dancing groups and bands after the Parade.

3. The use of at least one flat bed for the Cambridge High School Band.

4. The participation in the Parade of the prestigious members of the Cambridge Police, Fire Department and Cambridge City Hospital.

5. The raising of the Portuguese and American flags at City Hall on the morning of June 1, remaining raised until Friday June 6, 1986.

6. The hanging of two advertising banners, one across Prospect St. and one across Mass. Ave, exact locations still to be determined. This would be done the week prior to the Parade for the period of six (6) days.
