- ORDERED: That the City Manager direct both the Director of Traffic & Parking and the Commissioner of Public works to examine these problems as quickly as possible, and insure that these vendors will be in full compliance with all relevant City ordinances and, where non-compliance is found and persists, appropriate citations for violations will be issued; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council by February 12, 1990 to confirm that the content of this Order has been carried out and that the problems are in process of resolution.
