In Board of Aldermen, April 5 1865

The Joint Committee on Roads and Bridges to whom was referred the petition of A. M. Everett and others "that a Street may be opened ^{from} State to Main St in the vicinity of Village Street" have considered the same and respectfully report:

In the opinion of the Committee, there is great need of a Street, as prayed for, but on examination they find that the only feasible spot to build a street is through the garden of Mr. Benjamin Jones.

Your Committee have ascertained from Mr. Jones, that the land for a forty foot Street would cost about four thousand dollars (\$4000) and they decline to make any recommendation.
