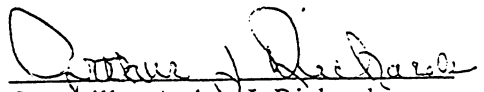

RESOLUTION

- Whereas, the Woodlawn Cemetery recently removed the nameplates from veterans' graves in order to facilitate grass cutting and many visitors want the name of their loved ones to be there; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved, that the Chelsea City Council requests and implores our neighbor, the Woodlawn Cemetery, to replace the nameplates on veterans' grave sites for the comfort of visitors and to improvise another method of grass cutting; and, be it further
- Resolved, that a copy of this resolve be conveyed to the Trustees of the Woodlawn Cemetery and also to the Legislative bodies of Boston, Cambridge, Somerville, Medford, Everett, Malden, Saugus, Revere and the Massachusetts House and Senate.
