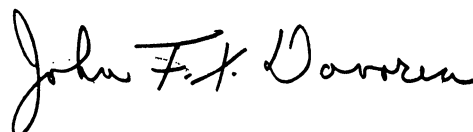

CONTINUATION SHEET 6A

A. Powers. The corporation shall have, and may exercise in furtherance of its corporate purposes, the following powers in addition to those permitted by law:

- (1) to purchase, receive, take by grant, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, employ, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;
- (2) to sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of, or mortgage, pledge, encumber or create a security interest in, all or any of its property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;
- (3) to purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, employ, sell, lend, lease, exchange, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, use and otherwise deal in and with, bonds and other obligations, shares, or other securities or interests issued by others, whether engaged in similar or different business, governmental, or other activities;
- (4) to make contracts, give guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge or encumbrance of, or security interest in, all or any of its property or any interest therein, wherever situated;
- (5) to lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested;
- (6) to pay pensions, establish and carry out pension, savings, thrift and other retirement and benefit plans, trusts and provisions for any or all of its directors, officers and employees, and for any or all of the directors, trustees, officers and employees of any corporation, fifty per cent or more of the shares of which outstanding and entitled to vote on the election of directors or trustees are owned, directly or indirectly, by it;
- (7) to be a partner in any enterprise which the corporation would have power to conduct itself;
- (8) to be an incorporator of other corporations of any type or kind; and

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

Transporting the Handicapped and Elderly in Massachusetts, Inc.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To analyze the mobility problems of the handicapped and elderly; to propose modifications of the existing and future public transportation facilities to make them completely accessible to the handicapped and elderly; to provide transportation services to the handicapped and elderly and to otherwise assist the handicapped and elderly with their problems of transportation.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes set forth in the Articles of Organization. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

The corporation may have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is formed; provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with Mass. G.L. c. 180 or any other chapter of the General Laws of the Commonwealth or Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

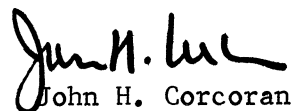
