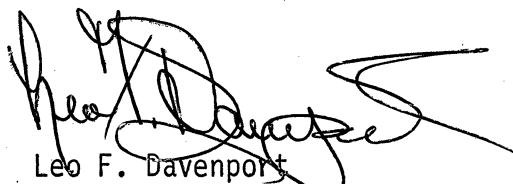

In response to City Council Order No. 10 of March 3, 1980, a number of steps have been taken to enforce the parking regulations in the area of 299 Concord Avenue.

There is a commercial establishment (Cambridge Alternative Power Co., Inc.) at this location that has very limited off street parking. This company has been notified that parking violations, especially parking on the sidewalk, will not be tolerated and these violations will be strictly enforced.

The uniform personnel assigned in this area have been informed of this situation and they will make every effort to stop these violations. These efforts will continue to prevent any reoccurrence of this problem in the future.

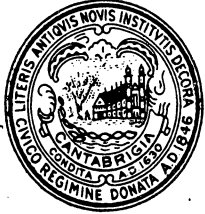

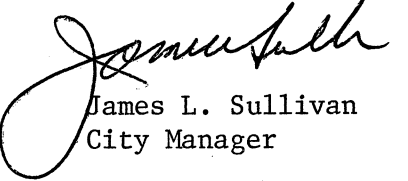
