APRIL 27, 1987

- WHEREAS: Several hundred flowering trees were planted within the last year or two on the Cambridge banks of the Charles River by the MDC; and
- WHEREAS: Another shipment of 220 trees is due to be planted momentarily; and
- WHEREAS: This planting has been done apparently without consulting Cambridge officials; and
- WHEREAS: The planting seems to be carried out in order to enhance the view of Cambridge from Boston, but also seems likely to interfere with the recreational space of Cambridge residents; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to request the MDC to halt this planting immediately until a plan that is fully acceptable to Cambridge is agreed to.
