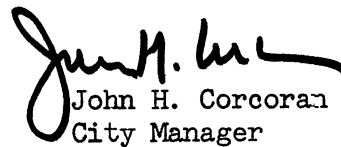
With reference to recent orders of your Honorable Body

Subject City Council Order

Reference

In reply to a recent Council order to demolish the Cambridge Incinerator, Mr. Richard McNamara, Purchasing Agent, has received bids to perform this work. The City received a low bid of \$22,500.00 which is very reasonable for this work. In view of the fact that a very serious danger exists at the site and that the city spends approximately \$50,000.00 per year for watchmen and other services required at the incinerator it would be more economical and provide better safety to demolish this structure. It is requested that the necessary funds be obtained to do this work.

The council order to repair sidewalks at 383 Walden Street and 239 Western Avenue has been complied with.

The council order to correct an unsanitary water condition at 47 to 55 Eighth Street has not been completed as yet. The entire street gutters must be rebuilt because there are no drains in this area.

The council order to correct a hazard on Portland Street requires a complete rebuilding of the street. Temporary repairs are being made and the street will be reconstructed next year.

The council order to follow the established rubbish schedules throughout the city can not entirely be complied with until the end of the year when the new equipment on order has arrived and the permanent work force is expanded.

The council order to establish street cleaning programs has been complied with and we are starting to implement the program. As you know we are now sweeping the Model Cities neighborhood as schedule, the industrial areas and main streets at night and the rest of the city on a schedule.

The council order to develop a plan for snow removal is being proposed and a separate report will be made later.
