June 12, 1978

- WHEREAS: On May 17, 1978 at approximately 4:00 A.M., the Cambridge Police Department responded to a reported accident in front of 1010 Memorial Drive, and
- WHEREAS: At the scene of the accident an automobile had left Memorial Drive and was submerged in the Charles River approximately 40 feet from the shore, and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge Police Officers Sgt. Dennis McCarthy and Patrol Officer John White, without regard for their own personal safety, dove into the Charles River in an attempt to enter the submerged automobile for the purpose of saving a human life, and
- WHEREAS: Sgt. McCarthy and Patrol Officer White displayed the highest tradition of courage and acted in the finest tradition of the Cambridge Police Department, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Thomas W. Danehy, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, and the City Council commend Sgt. McCarthy and Patrol Officer White for their brave actions, and further be
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be instructed to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to Sgt. McCarthy and Patrol Officer White and that a copy of this resolution be inserted in the personal records of Sgt. McCarthy and Patrol Officer White.
