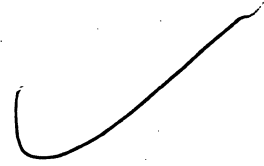

Margaret M. Deely, 82

Longtime nurse

Margaret M. (O'Shea) Deely of West Bridgewater, a retired registered nurse at the former Cambridge City Hospital School of Nursing, died Thursday at Brockton Hospital. She was 82.

She was born and raised in Brockton and attended high school there. She graduated from the Cambridge nursing school, where she stayed on to work for more than 35 years until her retirement in the early 1970s.

She moved to South Dennis in 1977. She lived for the past two years at the Life Care Center in West Bridgewater.

She was a former president of the St. Paul Mothers' Club, a member of the Matignon High School Mothers' Guild, and the Cambridge City Hospital Nurses Alumnae Association, and a volunteer with the Dennis Senior Citizen Center and Meals on Wheels.

She leaves a son, Francis X. Jr. of Hingham; two daughters, Mary Diggins of Arlington and Patricia Medeiros of Easton; a brother, James O'Shea of Chatham; a sister, Mary Murray of West Bridgewater; and five grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow at 11 a.m. in St. Pius X Catholic Church in South Yarmouth. Burial will be in Oak Ridge Cemetery in South Dennis.
